There are two “scales” or sets of questions used on the family survey. One scale is called “Impact on Families Scale”. This scale measures the extent to which early intervention services help families achieve positive outcomes, including those that must be reported to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) annually. The percentages reported above are derived from the “Impact on Families Scale.” The other scale is called “Family-Centered Services Scale” and measures the quality of family-centered services provided to families.
