---

### *from the east:*

take I-64 west to Richmond,  
take I-95 S via Exit 190 on the LEFT,  
merge onto Downtown Expy./I-195 N via  
Exit 74A toward I-195 N/Powhite  
Pkwy./VA-76 S,  
take Powhite Pkwy./VA-76 south (*Portions  
have toll*),  
exit Pkwy. onto Midlothian/ US-60 west,  
go 2.8 miles, turn right onto Koger Center  
Blvd.

---

### *from the north:*

I-95 south to Richmond,  
take EXIT 79 (I-64 W / I-195 S) toward  
Powhite Pkwy /Charlottesville (stay in left  
lane of exit),  
take I-195 S (Exit 186) toward Powhite  
Pkwy.,  
take Powhite Pkwy./VA-76 south  
(*Portions have toll*),  
exit Pkwy. onto Midlothian/ US-60 west,  
go 2.8 miles, turn R onto Koger Center Blvd.

---

### *from the west:*

I-64 toward Richmond,  
at Exit 175, take Rt. 288, to Chesterfield,  
exit Rt. 288 onto US Rt. 60 East  
(Midlothian Turnpike),  
go 5.7 miles,  
turn left onto Koger Center Blvd.

---

### *from the south:*

I-95 north toward Richmond,  
exit at Chippenham Pkwy (Exit 67),  
follow this to Midlothian Turnpike/US-60 W,  
go 4.4 miles, turn R onto Koger Center Blvd.
