EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES *(full-time with benefits as well as part-time opportunities available)*

- **11-23 Speech-Language Pathologist (full-time OR part-time):** Position provides early intervention services to developmentally delayed infants, birth through age two years and their families. The successful candidate will possess: thorough knowledge of the theories, principles, causes, therapeutic practices and techniques of speech and language pathology; good knowledge of the theories and principles related to infant/child development and good knowledge of counseling practices and techniques; good skills in teaching methods relative to infants/children; ability to communicate effectively, orally and in writing, and to relate well with infants and toddlers and their families. Master's Degree in Speech and Language Pathology and some professional work experience in the field, including some experience with infants and toddlers. Licensed by the Department of Health Professionals in Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology and certified in clinical competence by the American Speech and Hearing Association. Valid Virginia driver's license with acceptable driving record required.

- **10-98 Physical Therapist (part-time):** Position provides early intervention services to developmentally delayed and/or physically handicapped infants age birth to 3 years and their families. Incumbents function as part of a trans-disciplinary team providing services that focus on motor development and sensory integration, and implementing treatment plans developed by the team. The successful candidate should possess: Thorough knowledge of infant/child development, disabilities, and the theories, principles, practices and techniques of related therapeutic treatment; thorough knowledge of supportive counseling techniques; good skills in teaching methods relevant to infants/children; ability to maintain effective working relationships with individuals, families, staff and others; ability to communicate well, orally and in writing. Bachelor's (Master's preferred) in Physical Therapy and Licensure by the Department of Health Professionals of Virginia; some professional experience with developmentally disabled/delayed infants and their families. Valid Virginia driver's license with acceptable driving record required.
